Creative opportunities aimed at beginner, intermediate and advanced levels. Each course offers practical, straightforward training and advice from established, practicing printmakers.

Beginner/Refresher Courses are structured to develop key skills in each discipline. No prior experience of printmaking is needed.

Intermediate Courses give a more in depth understanding of techniques and processes. Focused on professional workshop practice, improving competency and building confidence. Only suitable for people with recent experience or who have passed a beginner class in their chosen discipline.

Advanced Courses aimed at the experienced printmaker and for those who have attended our Beginner/Refresher and Intermediate courses.

One-Day Tasters and the **Introduction to Printmaking Course** are aimed at people who are new to printmaking or who want to try out a technique to find out how it's done before committing to a full weekend or evening course. Also suitable for printmakers or people who want to develop new skills.

This year, artist Kate Downie RSA, will be teaching introduction and advanced mono printing courses and we are looking forward to learning more about chine colle from artist and member Lin Chau.

We have joined forces with Glasgow Press and Print Clan to bring you a brand new course **Print, Press, Pull!** Three Saturdays, Three Studios, Three Techniques. Each week will provide an introduction to one of the studios and give the chance to use the specialist facilities, exploring letter press, textile and paper screenprinting techniques.

Introduction to Printmaking - Beginner/Refresher

New to printmaking? This course will explore several printing techniques including monoprinting, woodcut, screenprint and etching.



An introduction to the processes will begin with a visit to our Archive room, looking at examples from our collection. Prints by Dame Elizabeth Blackadder, Ken Currie, Christine Borland, Ashley Cook and Alasdair Gray are just some of the examples you can take a look at before trying the process for yourself through short taster evening sessions. One full day will be dedicated to etching.

Lasercutting & Print One-Day - One Day *NEW

This one-day course introduces the laser cutter as a tool to make woodblocks that will print digitally made images – a marriage of the latest and oldest technology. You will learn how to split a digital image in to dots and produce a file that the lasercutter will use to engrave into wood. Once cut, you will ink and print up your block using our Columbian Eagle Press.

Introduction to Woodcut - Beginner/Refresher

During this course you will learn how to transfer your image onto Japanese plywood and experiment with woodcutting tools to create a variety of line and textured effects. 




Screenprinting - Intermediate

Gain a more in depth understanding of techniques and processes including screen coating, wash out methods, colour mixing, registration procedures and the possibilities of photo exposure and hand drawn stencils. *Prior screenprinting experience required*

Screenprinting - Advanced *NEW

This course is aimed at the experienced screenprinter who wishes to develop existing skills. Through a project-based weekend, which will cover advanced techniques including utilising manual and found positives, conventional film positives and digital positives. You will work with direct stencil based imaging, washout method, paper stencils and C.M.Y.K print techniques.

Etching - Beginner/Refresher

Etching uses acid to cut images into a metal plate, which is then inked and printed through a press. Learn the basics and explore this technique using soft grounds, hard grounds and aquatint to produce richly textured images.

Introduction to Photo Etching - Intermediate

An experimental 2 day course which will explore the principles of photo etching. Part of the course will be spent preparing artwork to expose onto plates. This will be done using computers and hand drawn processes. You will learn how to coat and expose photo etching plates and produce final prints. Experience of etching and basic computer skills are required.

Advanced Aquatint Etching - Advanced

This weekend course is all about aquatint; an etching process which enables you to create wide ranging tonal effects from very subtle to rich dark tones. You will learn about step bite, sugar lift, spit bite, soap ground aquatint with practical demonstrations and opportunity to try each process. The focus will be on learning and experimenting with each process, allowing you to explore further beyond the class.



Multi-Plate Etching - Advanced

This course will introduce you to multi-plate etching, opening up endless possibilities for colour printing. Offsetting an etched image from one plate on to one or more plates to achieve pin-point registration will be demonstrated. You will make your own plates and be encouraged to experiment with colour, looking at à *la poupée* inking and overlapping colour. The tutor will work with each participant to realise a finished multiplate print.

Intro to Monoprinting with Kate Downie RSA - Beginner/Refresher

Using painting and printmaking techniques this course will introduce you to the possibilities of this exciting process. Learn how to create your own unique monoprints from simple drawings or images. Experiment using different mark making techniques onto inked glass or Perspex surfaces then transfer your images onto paper using a press.

Experimental Monoprinting with Kate Downie RSA - Intermediate

The aim of this weekend course is to introduce participants to the wide range of techniques possible in monotype through the use of collage, drawing and multi-plate projects. Aimed at the experienced artist and printmaker, the course will encourage participants to pursue their artistic vision using monotype as a mark-making tool, exploring the difference between monoprint and monotype, and learning how each can be achieved through simple techniques. Marks can be achieved manually or with the use of an etching press and both will be explored over the two days. The tutor's approach will be energetic and open, as each student's individual style will dictate the direction of the workshop. *Prior monoprinting experience required*

Introduction to Collagraphy - Beginner/Refresher

Using the low-tech medium of collagraph, prepare plates using a variety of materials to build up layers and textures, experiment with inking, and print in monotone and colour.

Cancellation of courses by GPS


